

Dance Attire and Attendance

Dance attire is to be worn to all classes. The correct attire for all ballet classes consists of a solid color leotard, pink tights and pink ballet slippers. Skirts may be worn in Young Dancer levels 1-4 only. Jazz, Tap, and Modern classes may wear a solid color leotard with tan, pink or black tights in addition to the proper dance shoes. Black pants or shorts may be worn to these classes at all levels. Hip Hop classes are required to wear "clean" sneakers and moveable clothing. No jeans.

Please visit our website for an updated list of clothing and shoe requirements. An instructor cannot observe the movement of the students unless such attire is worn. It is absolutely necessary that the proper shoes and attire be worn to all classes.

Regular attendance is necessary to progress in dance at any age or level. Make-up classes for serious illness or inclement weather is always offered. If absenteeism is frequent, it is at the instructor's discretion whether to allow participate in the Annual Revue.

YOUNG DANCER DIVISION (LEVELS 1-9)

A division created to inspire our beginner and intermediate dancers. Students in YD Levels 1 & 2 begin with Ballet and/or Tap for 30 minutes each. Students in YD Levels 3-5 may choose to study Ballet, Tap, Jazz and Hip Hop for 30 minutes each. Once a student reaches YD Level 6 & 7 they begin to study subjects for 40 minutes each. When a dancer reaches YD Level 8 & 9 they not only study each subject for 45 minutes each, but they may also take Modern. (Pre School - Gr. 5)

MAIN DANCER DIVISION (LEVELS 1-6)

A division that will challenge our intermediate and advanced dancers. Students study each subject for 45-60 minutes. For advanced ballet students, pointe classes are also offered. (Gr. 6 - 12)

ADULT DANCE DIVISION

A division that will motivate our beginner and intermediate adult dancers. Classes are offered based on interest. Please email us for more information. Adult classes are not listed online.

DANCE COMPANY DIVISION

An exciting and demanding division for the advanced student who wishes to further their dance education beyond the studio. A Company tuition guide and handbook will be given to those students. (Audition required)

REGISTRATION AND TUITION

To register visit our website and click on your studio location. If you wish to submit a hard copy of the registration form, please email or call. Please refer to the master class schedule under your studio location tab prior to enrolling online.

Tuition rates are for the entire season (Sept-May or June) regardless of attendance or number of classes per month. For convenience, tuition is divided into 9 or 10 monthly installments (depending on studio location). If you choose to pay the entire season in full by September 15th, deduct 5% off your tuition total. Families with 2 students, deduct 20%, with 3 or more deduct 25% more off monthly tuition total. There is a \$15 annual registration fee due upon registering for classes. Add \$5 per additional student within one family.

THE ANNUAL REVUE

The Revue, or Recital is a part of the students' dance education and an extension of the benefits derived therein. It is not mandatory that all students participate. Costume payments are due by December 1st. More detailed information about costumes and the Recital can be found in the Student Handbook. Handbooks can be found under each studio location online. Our Recitals are currently held at the Providence Performing Arts Center and Kuss Middle School.
